## Recap: Bees' offense heats up behind Nemchek's dominant start

example was a 6-0 shutout of the Norwich Sea Unicorns this Sunday, August 8 at New Britain Stadium that kept the Bees' playoff hopes alive.

Leadoff hitter Alec Ritch was all over the field for the Bees on Sunday. After working a walk to start the inning, Ritch gave the Bees their first lead (and the winning run) when he stole home plate on a heads-up play from third. Ritch certainly did his part as the team combined for eight hits, but the game was won on the mound for New Britain. Meanwhile, Dawson Logie and Connor Podeszwa each threw two scoreless innings out of the bullpen. The whole staff had it going Sunday.

They have now won three of their last four games, two of which came over the Sea Unicorns, one of the teams they are chasing in the standings. The Bees currently stand three games back of
